Dear Elementary Teachers:

This publication contains a set of skill building "Do-Nows" that build upon the content of the DRSR project while helping prepare students for standardized testing. The content of the workbook contains warm ups based on basic traffic safety rules wrapped around 3rd grade ELAR and Math Teks. We recommend that each day you start your class with these warm up exercises. Not only will they help students establish a routine as they come into your classroom, but they teach important lessons on safety and responsibility while giving students guided practice in preparing for standardized testing. You can set a timer for five minutes (or longer at the beginning of the year) to help the students learn time management and apply themselves as soon as they walk through the door. Students can be provided with the correct answers in many ways:

- using a document camera or smart board, project the "Do Now" on the screen and ask a student to write out the correct answer(s);
- ask students to work in pairs to correct each other's work then compare to answer sheet; or
- in small groups, let students teach the lesson to their peers.

As the students practice with the question stems and skills it could evolve into independent practice or homework. New Law Requires More Kids to Use Booster Seats

June 2009

In Texas, a new law has passed that requires some children to use booster seats while riding in a vehicle. The new law was created to help safety belts fit children better. With <u>properly</u> fitting safety belts, children are safer while riding around. How do you know if you or one of your <u>siblings</u> needs to use a booster seat? Use the following guidelines to <u>determine</u> if you, a brother, or a sister needs to use a booster seat:

- Children who are younger than eight need to be in a "child passenger safety seat system."
- Children who are younger than eight, but are **taller** than four feet, nine inches *do not* need to be in a "child passenger safety seat system."
- Car seats and booster seats are both "child passenger safety seat systems."

So do you need a booster? Are you younger than eight or not taller than 4' 9"? If so, you need to ride in a booster. Share these guidelines with your parents to help you and your siblings stay safe!











New Law Requires More Kids to Use Booster Seats

June 2009

In Texas, a new law has passed that requires some children to use booster seats while riding in a vehicle. The new law was created to help safety belts fit children better. With <u>properly</u> fitting safety belts, children are safer while riding around. How do you know if you or one of your <u>siblings</u> needs to use a booster seat? 

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



Did you know school buses are one of the safest ways to get to school? Even so, it is important to be smart when riding a bus. With lots of fun field trips coming up, Miss Neville's class decided to learn about bus safety. The class spent a week <u>researching</u> information about bus safety. Here are some of the safety tips they learned:

- 1. The most dangerous part about riding a bus to school is getting on and off the bus. It is really important to be extra careful when entering or <u>exiting</u> a bus.
- 2. Never run to your bus stop. Walk to the bus, even if you are going to be late.
- 3. Stand back from the street and curb, and stay back until the bus has come to a complete stop. Only start to get on the bus after the driver has opened the door.
- 4. If you have to cross the street to get on the bus, walk far in front of the bus so that you can see the driver's face, and the driver can see you. Always cross in front, not behind the bus.



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




